The hall has been Covid risk assessed and all necessary precautions installed. Reluctantly we did agree to increase the precept this year to make up for the shortfall in income. However this still leaves us as with one of the lowest precepts in the Borough.

The office has worked tirelessly throughout the Pandemic with staff working from home or in the office in line with guidelines. This has led to a few problems but staff have coped admirably. I thank all staff for their dedication and hard work during these difficult times and hope that very soon we will all be able to return to some sort of normality.

At the moment we only have two caretaking members of staff who have kept the hall and office clean and covid safe. For much of the year Alan was the only one actually working. Debbie was furloughed but is back working now. Special thanks to Alan who has also carried out many maintenance and repair works at the hall and around the Parish. We will continue to operate with just two caretakers for the time being until business starts to get back to normal when the arrangements will be reconsidered.

The sale of Wildfell Close has finally gone through and work has started on the site. The CIO application for Walderslade Woods is in its final stages and hopefully will be acceptable to the Charities Commission which will then enable us to sort out the finances and set up the CIO.

I have decided that due to health issues I need to take a back seat for a while and therefore, reluctantly, am stepping down as your Chairman. My year as Chairman has be very limited as regards to functions a Chairman normally undertakes due to the Pandemic,
