## Item 7 Planning Decisions, Appeals and Appeals Decisions - INFORMATION

The Granary, Court Lodge Farm, Boxley. Planning appeal – dismissed.

The Parish Council did not object to the planning application.

*Conclusion* taken from appeal decision document.

14. It is appreciated that the appellant is an active member of the community in Boxley and has contributed to village life by purchasing and safeguarding the Kings Arms public house and redeveloping the previously unattractive farmyard area. It would also provide an opportunity for the appellant's son and daughter to remain in the village. In any event the proposal would provide an additional windfall dwelling which would have social and economic benefits for the village and make a small but useful contribution towards housing land supply. It would utilise redundant garden land and be constructed to meet environmental standards. There is no objection from Boxley Parish Council or the Council's Conservation Officer. However, these arguments and benefits, even in combination, do not outweigh the significant harm that has been identified under the main issue.

15. Because the site lies within the Kent Downs AONB, where paragraph 115 of the National Planning Policy Framework indicates that development should be restricted, the presumption in favour of sustainable development does not apply in this case even if there is no five year supply of housing land in the district.

16. Having regard to the above the appeal should be dismissed.

# Item 8 Highways and Byways - INFORMATION

8.1 Boxley Parish road classifications. Members asked for a briefing on the road classifications within the parish.

In KCC's USRN (Unique street reference number) Road number classification, basically an inventory of the roads, classifications, speed limits and length there are 273 listings but there is some repetition on the road names and individual roundabouts are listed. The parish office has a copy of this information.

There are 5 classes of road: A, B, C, U (unclassified) and P (Private and unmaintained public highways).

Within Boxley Parish there are approximately

- 7 A roads including the A229, Walderslade Woods Road A2045, Newnham Court roundabout, Cobtree roundabout, Bearsted Road, Running Horse roundabout.
- No B roads
- C roads including parts of The Street and Pilgrims Way, Bearsted Lane (also a partial A road), New Cut Road, Forstal Road, Lidsing Road. Dunn Street and Sandling Lane. These roads can have 30 – 60 mph speed limits
- P roads. Approx. 14 roads but some only have partial lengths as P. Well know private roads are Forge Lane and Grove Green Lane. Public but unmaintained are Cossington Lane, Longwood, parts of Abigail Crescent. It is not unusual for small closes that have been built off of larger roads e.g. Brockbank Close Impton Lane, to not be adopted after the first few yards. To obtain clearer information there would need to be individual searches on the KCC road gazetteer which is available on the KCC website.
- Unclassified roads. These are the majority of roads within the parish and U roads can have 30
   60 mph speed limits

## Item 9 Tree Preservation Orders – INFORMATION & DECISION

Maidstone Borough Council's policy is (Clerk has used bold to highlight relevant section)

Trees considered for a TPO must be very publicly visible, in good condition and **under immediate threat of damage or removal**. If there is a tree that is under threat that you think should be protected you can ask for a TPO assessment by completing our online form.

If the tree is eligible for a TPO we can make a legal order which is effective immediately. This is called a provisional TPO. We notify the landowners and owners of neighbouring land which may be affected by the Order, who are able to object to or support the TPO. We will confirm, withdraw or amend the TPO within six months based on any comments we receive.

Members have previously asked for a Downs Mail article to encourage residents to proactively report trees that could be identified for protection because of their contribution to the street scene etc. but like Ancient Woodland MBC is not willing to consider any submissions unless there is an imminent threat. This issue has been referred to Maidstone KALC as it echoes the concerns raised at 4.10 Ancient Woodland.
