Thank you for your recent correspondence, enclosing a petition in relation to "installing a safer crossing point on Grovewood Drive North, Grove Green between the top of Provender Way and Shepherds Gate Drive". As KCC is now in the purdah period before the County Council elections on 4 May, I am responding to your petition instead of the Cabinet Member for Environment and Transport.

I can confirm that Boxley Parish Council and Maidstone Borough Council have recently raised this issue with Kent County Council and there may be funding available for this. Following a report from Boxley Parish Council, who wish to discuss a number of other Highway issues as well, we will be working with the Parish Council and Maidstone Borough Council to look at a possible safe crossing point location and parking issues experienced by residents in Grove Green.

Initial contact has been made with Boxley Parish Council and will be followed shortly with a meeting to discuss their issues further.

As of this time KCC has not yet contacted the parish office.

The parish office has contacted the Parks and Open Spaces Department and also placed a request for replacement bins on the MBC website.

9.3 KCC Highway Asset Management Report.

Clerk's report. Members will have seen the Highway Asset Management article in the April 2017 KALC Parish News. The following is an extract from the document and it is produced not because

members might be able to influence the strategy but to inform them of possible changes to service and also to the way KCC is approaching its responsibilities.

Foreword

The Government has changed the rules for funding local road maintenance. An increasing proportion of this funding is dependent on local authorities being able to show that they use asset management techniques in highway maintenance. As a forward thinking authority, we are already doing much of that and are committed to further embedding asset management principles into our day-to-day management of our roads. This includes understanding their lifecycle cost so that we can make informed investment decisions, maximise efficiency and value-for-money, and ensure that we have well-managed highway infrastructure that is fit for purpose, not only now but for future generations.

Asset management alone will not address the challenges ahead. Local roads in England carry around two thirds of all traffic. They are vital for the well-being of local communities, economic growth, jobs and housing. The country needs to reconsider the balance between local road maintenance spend and motorway/trunk road investment if we are to avoid a significant deterioration in local road condition in the next decade.

Clerk's note: KCC are continuing to review their assets however the document did not show any real funding identified to target improvements in B, C and unclassified roads 2017 32% of B&C roads marked as poor or very poor. By 2026 KCC hopes to reduce this figure to 29%

2017 21% of unclassified roads are shown as very poor (there is no poor rating shown, the roads are either good or very poor). By 2026 KCC hopes to reduce this figure to 16%

Levels of Service

When determining levels of service we consider up to four options in the context of our statutory obligations, the County Council's Strategic Objectives, customer expectations and the available budget:

Asset/Service Level Enhancement An approach that fulfils our statutory obligations and enables the overall condition of the asset group to be enhanced. Interventions such as maintenance, asset renewals and improvements are undertaken on a planned, prioritised basis with a view to increasing the proportion of the asset group in a very good or good condition.

Steady State A level of service and investment that fulfils our statutory obligations and preserves the overall condition of the asset in its current state. Interventions such as maintenance and asset renewals are undertaken on a planned, prioritised basis **with a view to keeping the same proportions of the asset group in a very good, good, poor and very poor condition** [Clerk's emphasis]. Any investment less than this would mean that a steady state condition or existing service level could not be achieved. *Clerk's comment: KCC has identified this level for most services.*

Service Level Reduction A level of service that fulfils our statutory duties and facilitates a more controlled approach. Interventions such as maintenance and asset renewals are undertaken on a planned, optimised basis. Clerk's comment: KCC will be reducing urban grass cutting from eight per year to five or six. Vision display cuts remain at thee per year. Hedge cutting will effectively remain at one per year. As any asset e.g. unlit road sign becomes damaged there will be a full scale assessment as to whether the sign is the correct type, in the right place and whether its removal would impact on road safety by increasing RTA. KCC also has a wish to declutter the landscape of unnecessary signs.

Statutory Minimum The minimum level of service that fulfils our statutory duties. Asset condition is allowed to decline with interventions such as maintenance and asset renewals undertaken on a reactive basis if and only if they are necessary to fulfil our legal obligations. This is an extremely inefficient approach Asset Management in Highways Implementing approach to asset management in highways and will cost the authority more over the lifecycle of our assets and therefore cannot be recommended.




Item 11 Maidstone Local Plan Community Infrastructure Levy: Draft Charging Schedule Statement of Modifications


Clerk's briefing note: Deadline for any response to the changes being made is 22 May.

The statement shows a number of changes to the originally proposed urban and rural boundaries and includes an amendment to the Residential Charging Zones at MBLP Site RMX1 (1) Newnham Park. The map (nest page) shows the modification, which had previously been highlighted as a change to the urban boundary. The accompanying statements are also modified to reflect the change to the boundary and therefore the charges that would be made.

Item 14 Volunteer Groups - INFORMATION

14.1 Friends of Boxley Warren Annual Report 2016 - 2017

This has been a year where progress has been achieved even though we experienced a number of problems. These were mainly caused by people riding off road vehicles along the Pilgrims way disregarding the safety and rules regarding not being allowed to do so. We have been at a loss at times as to how to stop it happening and avoiding the risks to the volunteers and the public who enjoy the area on foot. Our efforts to enlist the help and assistance of the Police however did bear fruition recently when their Rural Team of 3 policemen on trials bikes did a sweep of the area and stopped 16 vehicles who when questioned turned out to be committing quite a number of different offences. Due to the diligence of the PCSO and the parish office publicity materialised in the Kent Messenger and that we hope will get the message out that they are NOT WELCOME.

We have been able to carry out some task days and most recently cleared away growth at the entrance to the Warren from 6 young small leaf Lime trees that were planted a couple of years ago. They were in very good condition.

Steve wrote out a programme of work (that was broken down into 3 stages) to remove invasive sycamore from the bund that runs along the eastern edge of the Pilgrims Way. With the sterling assistance of Jane they completed stage 1 which has now enabled people to have a clear view of the escarpment as you walk along the road.

Work was also undertaken to clear the area around the viewing seat, create new glades along the road and also cut back growth from around the first pond.

Discussions have been held with Kent Wildlife Trust and other organisations regarding obtaining future funding. We hope to be successful from a recent grant that was awarded for a project entitled Old Chalk New Downs. A recent meeting of the Management Committee was postponed unfortunately where we had hoped that news would be forthcoming about future work plans and awards.

We are a small group of volunteers in number but have been excited by one new member Martin who is very keen to develop work on the Flora and Fauna on the Warren. He has been in touch with various people and Plant life at Ranscomb and will be coordinating some of our task days on this work. A study was done during the year on the field mice on site and the results forwarded to us.

Finally may we express our sincerest thanks to the parish office staff for invaluable assistance during the year and moving all their equipment in the office to enable us to have meetings.

The company will report the findings of its investigation, which not only included interviews but also a period of observation within the planning department itself, to MBC in the next three weeks. The company's report will include proposals for improvement and it will recommend that the report is openly discussed and that feedback is given to all interviewees.

15.2 Junction 8 M20, Appeal to Planning Inspectorate. The Maidstone BC Planning Committee is considering a report not to defend its 2015 decision to refuse planning permission as due to the emerging local plan there is little or no defence and a probability that if the appeal is granted MBC will face huge costs.
